BEFORE LEAVING YOUR HOME COUNTRY

RECOGNIZED DEGREES

› Le Diplôme de design Bac +5 : a state recognized master's degree in design

The Diplôme de design is based on a five-year curriculum, divided into two cycles (a 3-year undergraduate program followed by a 2-year master's course).

L'École de design Nantes Atlantique is one of the very few design school(s) to have obtained certification from the French Ministry of Higher Education and Research for its Master's degree in design. This degree is also registered in the Registre National des Certifications Professionnelles (the French directory for vocational qualifications or RNCP) as a Level 7 Master's degree.



› DN MADE, a fully recognized undergraduate degree

L'École de design Nantes Atlantique also offers DN MADE, National Diplomas in Fine Crafts and Design. The DN MADE leads to the award of a bachelor degree after three years of studies.



ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The academic year starts end of August and finishes in early July. The year comprises vacation periods, including two weeks at the end of the year (Christmas and New Year).

For exchange students, the 1st semester usually starts end of August and finishes by the end of January at the latest. The second semester lasts from early February to the end of June.

ECTS : EUROPEAN CREDIT TRANSFER SYSTEM

L'École de design Nantes Atlantique has implemented the European ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) to ensure the academic recognition of studies abroad.

ECTS credits are distributed over different teaching units in proportion to the work they require. Each teaching unit has been assigned a number of ECTS credits on the basis of 60 credits for an academic year (30 credits per semester).

- › Preparatory Program for undergraduate
studies: €5,500

No tuition fees are required for exchange students who pay the tuition fees of their own university.

• Installments

Tuition fees can be settled in installments as follows :

- › When handing in your full registration form after being accepted: you must submit a 25 % deposit by bank transfer to confirm you accept your admission.
- › Payment will be settled through five direct withdrawals on your bank account (on the 15th of each month, from October to February).

• Scholarships

The school itself does not offer any scholarship. However, according to your country of residence and your particular situation, different possibilities may be available to finance your studies in France: government grants, funding granted by international organizations and NGOs, private fellowships...

Campus France has a scholarship search engine which may help you identify a scholarship available in your situation (country of residence, degree being prepared etc.)

PREPARING YOUR ARRIVAL: FEEL FRANÇAIS PLATFORM

Feel Français are our partner specialized in assisting international students in preparing their arrival in Nantes. All students accepted to the school will be given a personal login to the Feel Français platform.

Non-European students

- › Private health insurance to cover the medical expenses that the french social security do not cover (otherwise you can buy a top up health insurance when you are in France)
- › Money for rent and deposit
- › A copy of your birth certificate showing your parents' information in original language (mother tongue)
- › Your bank details in your home country
- › Passport and visa



European students

- › 4 passport photos
- › An accommodation certificate (we will give you this when you arrive)
- › A copy of your school certificate in French
- › Private health insurance to cover the medical expenses that the french social security do not cover (otherwise you can buy a top up health insurance when you are in France)
- › Money for rent and deposit
- › A copy of your birth certificate showing your parents' information in original language (mother tongue)
- › Your bank details in your home country
- › Your ID card or passport
- › European Health Insurance Card valid for the period of stay.
- › Your student card from your home university

OFII Procedure and renewal of residency permit

Holders of a VISA VLS-TS (Visa long séjour valant titre de séjour) have to validate it online within 3 months after the arrival in France on the OFII website (<https://www.ofii.fr/en>).

Students will need to buy a fiscal stamp online on the OFII website, the stamp costs 50 euros.

This validation is compulsory. Students wishing to extend their stay beyond the dates on their visa must request a residency permit (carte de séjour) from the Prefecture in Nantes.

This online process must be started 2 months before the visa expiry date via this link: <https://administration-etrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/particuliers/#/>

STUDENT VISA

If your stay in France lasts for more than three months, you will need to obtain a long-term student visa before your arrival in France. The request for the form must be made at least 3 months before your departure.

- **International students can apply for an online visa on France-Visas** (<https://france-visas.gouv.fr/en>). The new service is accessible to students applying for a long stay visa living in a country where visa application is outsourced and available online. This service helps accelerate the transfer to the outsourced service provider.

Digital visa application prerequisites

To complete a digital visa application, you must comply with the following conditions:

- › Be an international student applying for studies in France;
- › Apply for a long-stay visa for studies only; and
- › Live in a country including an outsourced service provider collecting visa applications.

Online visa application steps

If you comply with the prerequisites, you may apply for a student visa by completing the following four steps:

1. Complete your online visa application on France-Visas and transfer your documents;
2. Submit in person your passport and completed form at the collection centre;
3. Follow your online application on the service provider's website; and
4. Retrieve your passport.

- **To students applying for a long stay visa living in a country where visa application is not outsourced and not available online**, the request for the form must be made at the French embassy or consulate in your country of residence at least 3 months before your departure or at your local Campus France.

A visa is not required for students who are citizens of the following countries or zones:

- › the European Union (EU)
- › the European Economic Area (EEA)
- › Andorra, Monaco, San Marino, Switzerland or the Vatican.



ARRIVAL IN NANTES

ACCOMMODATION

L'École de design Nantes Atlantique grants you access to the school's housing platform that will greatly facilitate your search for an accommodation in Nantes and on which you will be able to:

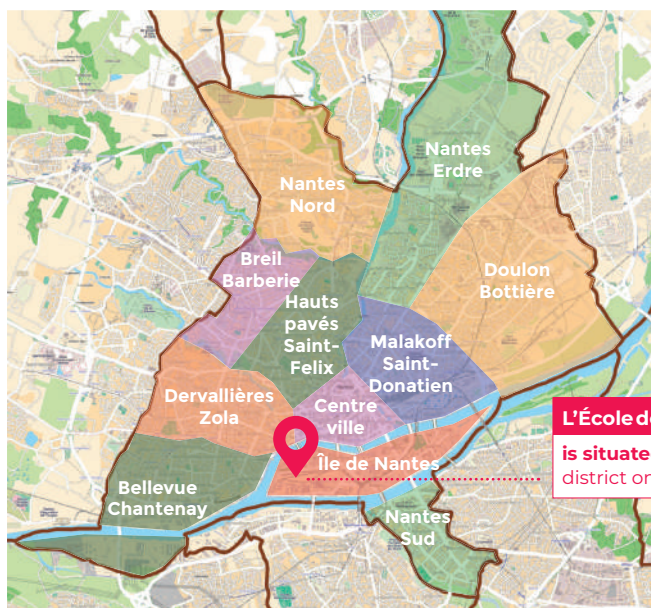
- › Find a rental close to the campus
- › Find a room in student residences
- › Find your international or French roommate(s) and form shared rentals
- › Find a subletting
- › Find a private rental
- › Find a room in a French family (ideal for the experience)

A number of accommodations from private owners, halls of residence, real estate agencies, or rooms in private homes, are available close to the school.

University residence

L'École de design Nantes Atlantique has a partnership with the CROUS, which manages the university halls of residence. A certain number of rooms in student residences, are reserved by L'École de design for international students.

HOUSING BENEFIT (APL) FROM THE CAF

You may be eligible for housing benefit if...

- › You are renting, House/flat sharing,
- › You are living in an apartment, a university residence, a hostel, a furnished flat, a hotel, a room in a private home,

USEFUL INFORMATION

The amount of housing benefit awarded depends on your taxable income in France or abroad, on the type of your accommodation and the amount of rent paid

If you had very little or no income, your benefit is calculated on a flat-rate basis depending on your situation.

Only means-tested grants and Erasmus grants are non-taxable.

You can claim housing benefit the month after you satisfy all the criteria for applying. If you apply late, your claim will not be backdated.

HOUSING INSURANCE

The housing insurance is a mandatory document in France to get the key to your accommodation. It covers you and your accommodation in case of fire, flood damage, theft etc

Students purchase their own housing insurance through the Feel Français platform before arrival › www.feelfrancais.com

CIVIL LIABILITY INSURANCE

Whether you are a student or an employee, civil liability insurance is mandatory in France and covers you for any damage you may cause to a third party or property. The school will ask you for this in your first week. Students can purchase this insurance through the Feel Français platform › www.feelfrancais.com

CVEC (CONTRIBUTION VIE ÉTUDIANTE ET DE CAMPUS)

All students must pay the “Contribution à la vie étudiante et de campus” (CVEC) to finalize their registration. This contribution, collected by the CROUS (Regional Centers of University and Schools) is intended to promote the reception and social support, health, culture and sports of students. CVEC is a tax that validates your registration in a higher education institution.

The CVEC contribution is set at just under €100 per year.

Exchange students are not subject to the CVEC. Students with a Campus France scholarship are exempt from paying the CVEC but must go online anyway and download their certificate free of charge.



HEALTH INSURANCE

In France, enrolment in higher education leads to membership to the students social security scheme. The French social security is now free for all international students.

The administrative procedure may differ depending on your situation:

- **International students from the European Union, European Economic Area, United Kingdom and Switzerland**

- › If you already have health insurance coverage in your country, you do not need to sign up for the French State health insurance. In this case, you must bring your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) valid for the duration of your stay.
- › We recommend that you come to France with your own private health insurance. However, we will also be able to put you in contact with an insurance company in order to sign up for a top-up health insurance policy after your arrival in France.

- **Non-European students**

- › You must get registered online at the French social security (CPAM). This registration is mandatory and must be done as soon as you arrive in France. You will receive an email with a procedure to follow. › www.etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr
- › You will benefit from the same level of coverage as other students and benefit from a free healthcare
- › We recommend that you come to France with your own private health insurance. However, we will also be able to put you in contact with an insurance company in order to sign up for a top-up health insurance policy after your arrival in France.

Finding a GP

- › You can make an appointment with the doctor of your choice, the price is €25 for a consultation with a GP. If you need to see a specialist you will often need to first go to the GP and ask for a referral (with the exception of gynecologists, ophtamologists and psychiatrists who you can contact directly).
- › You can make an appointment online via the Doctolib website › www.doctolib.fr
It is possible to select doctors who speak English. A GP is known as a “medecin généraliste” in France.
- › Your buddy can help you to make an appointment if necessary.

BENEFIT FROM THE NANTES UNIVERSITY HEALTH SERVICE

The school has set up a partnership with the health service of Nantes University in order to give a free of charge access to its students to the same health resources as university students. This partnership is extended for this new 2024-2025 school year.

Students at L'École de design Nantes Atlantique will benefit, among other things, from consultations with :

- › general practitioners
- › gynecologists
- › addictologists
- › psychologists and psychiatrists
- › school planning and examinations.

This service can be accessed by booking an appointment online. You will first need to create and activate your account on › univ-nantes.contactsante.fr/RendezVous

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

It is highly recommended to open a bank account as soon as you arrive if you wish to receive housing benefits, medical reimbursements and obtain a bank card and / or a checkbook. Ask your usual bank if it is associated with a French network, it can facilitate the procedure.

To open a bank account in France, you will have to provide the following documents :

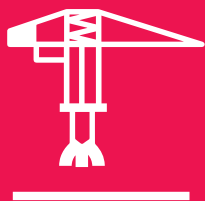
- › copy of your school certificate or copy of your student card
- › copy of your ID card or passport
- › copy of your Visa (for non-european students)
- › proof of address in France (housing certificate, rent receipt etc.)

Payment by credit card is accepted by most merchants, but sometimes a minimum amount is required (about €10/15). Many ATMs are available in most places. Some banks will charge you a small fee if you use another ATM than theirs.

Banks are normally open from Monday to Friday, from 09:00 until 16:00 (17:00 at some branches). Some banks are open on Saturday mornings or all day long, in which case they are closed on Monday.

LIVING AND STUDYING IN NANTES

NANTES, AN ATTRACTIVE METROPOLIS

The creative capital of Western France.

L'École de design Nantes Atlantique is located in Nantes, the 6th biggest city in France is located 50 km from the Atlantic Ocean and 342 km from Paris (a two-hour trip with the TGV high-speed train). Well recognized for its quality of life, Nantes is known for its economic dynamism, vibrant cultural life and support for contemporary creation, and was awarded European Capital of Innovation in 2019 by the European Commission.



A HIVE OF CULTURAL ACTIVITY

The cultural life of Nantes is abundant:

- › The Machines de l'Île (and its famous Great Elephant) - an exhibition and events space open all year round - are located right next to the buildings of L'École de design Nantes Atlantique;
- › The «Voyage à Nantes» lets you discover works of art in the public space;
- › Major events also punctuate the daily life of the people of Nantes, such as La Folle Journée, Hip OPsession, Les Rendez-vous de l'Erdre and the Scopitone festival...
- › Many museums such as the Museum of Arts, the Museum of Natural History, the Musée Dobrée or the Château des Ducs de Bretagne





L'ÎLE DE NANTES

A place of culture and innovation

« Ile de Nantes » is an effervescent site, emblematic of the city, which hosts many economic and cultural actors (startups, artists' collectives, exhibition halls, theaters and concert halls, bars and restaurants).

The school is located in the heart of the Quartier de la Création, which aims to promote synergies between higher education, research and the entire creative ecosystem. With nearly 5,000 students, this district has become a creative campus of international reference.

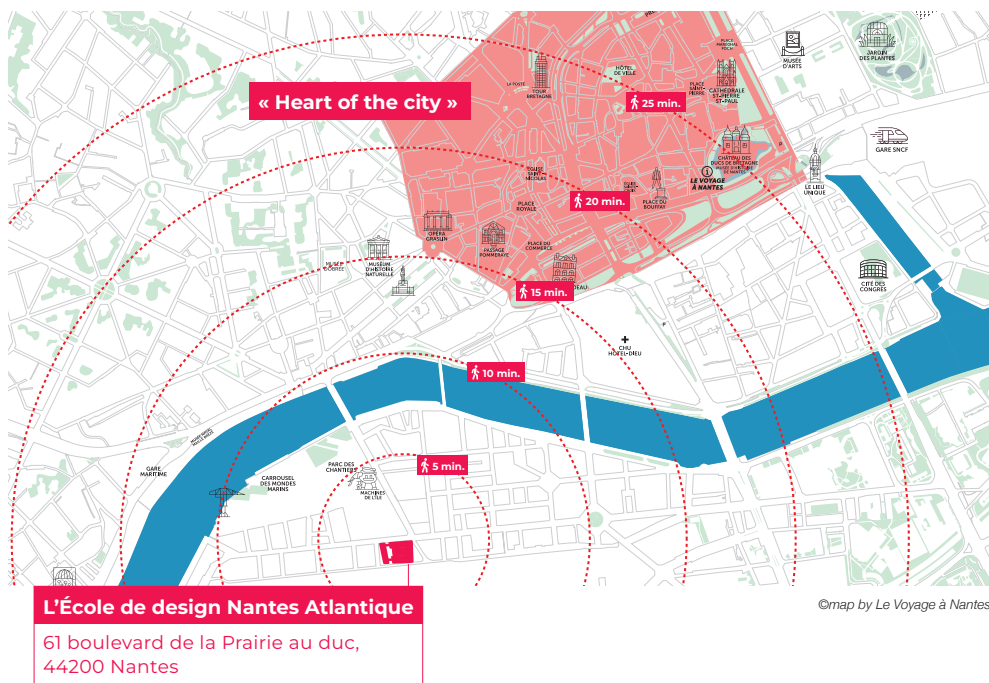

COMING TO SCHOOL

Considering the top location of the school, students can come easily from all over the city by bike, walking or with public transports.



A GREEN CITY THAT'S A GREAT PLACE TO LIVE AND STUDY

For many years, Nantes has been one of the top French cities for quality of life. It has many parks and gardens (including the magnificent Jardin des Plantes in the heart of the city or the amazing Japanese Garden on the Île de Versailles), waterways, historic buildings, bicycle paths...



“Nantes by bike!”:

Naolib bike is the public bicycle system in Nantes.

TRANSPORT IN NANTES

Two lines serve the school :

① Tram line 1

The Tram line 1 connects the northwest to the northeast of the metropolis and serves downtown Nantes.

› **The closest stop to the school is:**
“Chantiers Navals”.

The Tram line 1 also connects to Tram lines 2 and 3 (which serve the southwest and the north of the city) at “Commerce” stop, as well as to Busway line 4 (which serves the southeast of the city) at “Duchesse Anne - Château” stop.

⑤ Busway line 5

The Busway line 5 runs along the entire length of the Île de Nantes between the SNCF South Station and the Hangar à Bananes.

› **The closest stop to the school is:**
“Prairie au Duc”.

The Busway line 5 also connects to Tram lines 2 and 3 (which serve the southwest and the north of the city) at “Vincent Gâche” stop, as well as to Busway line 4 (which serves the southeast of the city) at “Île de Nantes” stop.

› naolib.fr

The company of transport of Nantes (Naolib) runs a network of buses and tramways all over and around the city. To use the system, students will have to buy a monthly ticket.

- Annual Pass (under 26): €238
(10 installments of €23,80)
- Annual Pass (over 26): €525
(10 installments of €52,50)
- A one hour ticket for buses and tramways: €1,80 but €2 when you buy the ticket on the bus
- A book of ten tickets: €17
- ***On weekends (saturday and sunday):
Public transport is free!***



“Nantes by boat!”:

«Navibus» is part of the Naolib public transport network. You can therefore access it with a 1-hour ticket or an Annual Pass.

One boat station is located on the Île de Nantes and is close to the school:

THE BUILDING'S EQUIPMENTS

L'école de design Nantes Atlantique in the heart of the creative district

This unique site offers a working area of 11,500m², in a building specially designed to meet the school's needs and which represents the largest real estate investment in France in the last ten years in the field of design.

The school provides access to all the tools and equipments necessary for creation and experimentation:

- › **700 m² model-making workshop :** machine workshops, ceramics, resin molding, flexible materials, painting booth, publishing and silk-screening space, laser cutting and 3D printers.
- › **Studio for media production and digital experimentation.**
- › **More than 120 computer workstations** in Mac and PC environments, and rooms equipped with Cintiq screens.
- › **A Learning Lab:** a space for educational experimentation and innovation for students and teaching teams.
- › **Design Labs** to connect Research, Pedagogy and Innovation.
- › **A conference room** (with 180 seats).
- › **Project studios** (with 20 to 40 seats).
- › **Visual arts rooms.**
- › **Classroom facilities for lectures.**

ERASMUS STUDENT NETWORK (ESN)

The Erasmus Student Network is one of the largest, interdisciplinary student organisations in Europe. It looks after international students and helps them to settle into their new surroundings. It organizes a whole range of activities, services, and trips for international students. In Nantes, the ESN association is called "Autour du Monde". A presentation of their activities will be given to international students during their first week at the school.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT UNION

The student union within the school is called the BDE (Bureau des Etudiants).

The BDE organize a number of parties, events and sporting and cultural activities for French and international students all year round. A group within the BDE deals specifically with international students. They organize activities for international students but also ensure international students are integrated into all the school activities.

They communicate with international students in English via a dedicated Facebook page and an Instagram page set up for international students. The BDE international group will present these activities and events to international students during their integration week.

BUDDY SERVICE!

International students can be allocated a buddy to help them settle into and adapt to their life in France. To sign up for the buddy service, go to the **Feel Français platform**.

Mentors are a point of contact before the arrival of the student and can, depending on their availability, meet students when they arrive in Nantes. They continue to be a helping hand to international students throughout the semester.

Buddies are all student volunteers (French and international) who have already spent at least, one year at school and in Nantes. They are the best guides and are very enthusiastic to welcome new international students to Nantes.



EATING NEAR SCHOOL

On campus: The school is located 100 meters from a new student social catering center managed by the « Centres Régionaux des Oeuvres Universitaires et Scolaires (CROUS »). These university restaurant offers the best in terms of value for money: 3,30€ per meal (starter, main meal and dessert). There are other CROUS cafeterias in Nantes, ask the CROUS for a list. › www.crous-nantes.fr

There are other possibilities nearby the school. Students have the option of eating lunch on site, the cafeteria is equipped with microwaves and snack machines.

Big supermarkets (E.Leclerc, Carrefour or Auchan) are usually found in commercial zones on the outskirts of towns, but you will also find smaller supermarkets (Carrefour market, Intermarché, Super U, Monoprix etc.) within the city center.

A minimum monthly food budget would be somewhere between €200 to €250.*

USEFUL TIPS

- **Opening hours**

Shops are open from 9am to 7pm, Mondays to Saturdays, sometimes they close at lunchtime. Most supermarkets are open from 9am to 7pm, sometime until 9 pm, Mondays to Saturdays.

Please note you will find very few grocery stores open on Sunday.

Public Administration Office are usually open Mondays to Fridays : 9am to 12.30am and from 2pm to 5pm.

Post offices are usually open 9am - 6pm, Mondays to Fridays, sometimes they close at lunch-times, and some city post offices open on Saturday morning.

- **Launderettes**

If you are a resident in a students' hall of residence you will find washing machines in the basement. There are also several launderettes in town (approx. €3,50 per machine).

- **Anti-tobacco legislation**

Smoking is forbidden in public places. If you break this law you are liable to receive a fine. Since the anti-tobacco laws were passed, places such as cafes and restaurants are obliged to provide outside smoking areas.

Within the school, smoking is forbidden, but you can smoke outside the premises, where you will find ashtrays.

- **Alcohol**

The legal drinking age in France is currently 18.

If you have to drive, remember that the permitted alcohol level is 0.5 grams/litre, equivalent to about 2 small glasses of wine.

- **Don'ts**

Most businesses do not like clients to bargain for goods or services (restaurants, hotels, clothing, food).

- **Tips**

Unlike other countries, tipping is not obligatory in France, as service is included in all prices. However you may leave a tip if you wish.
